Forest School

"Forest School is an inspirational process that offers ALL learners regular opportunities to achieve and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in a woodland or natural environment with trees" (FSA)

Forest school sessions will begin in October. They are a programme of sessions that the children attend each week learning new skills, having new experiences and being able to take risks in a safe environment. Forest School provides children with an opportunity to freely express themselves, to overcome fears and anxieties, to play outdoors and develop independence as they learn new skills.

The children will be engaged in a range of activities including den building, bug hunting, learn about fire safety, toast marshmallows and make hot chocolate! They are provided with a magical environment to ignite their imaginations as they look for the Forest School Fairies and develop their own stories.

Forest School is an ideal opportunity to engage children in learning in a fun and magical way, linking all areas of development to the activities whilst developing them as individuals.

All ages will participate in the sessions which will be adapted accordingly. The sessions will be run by Sam who is a level 5 qualified nursery nurse and Level 3 qualified in forest school. We will seek parental permission for your child to attend these sessions before they begin in October.

The ladybird room has seen the big children leave for school and we wish them all the very best of luck for September. We had a lovely prom in July for all the leavers and had lots of fun!

Over the summer holidays we have planned some 'theme weeks' for both the pre school and holiday club children, which have been very successful! Following on from a 'Beech week' in July we have a 'cooking Week', 'Animal Week', 'Sport Week' and 'Princess and Pirate Week' throughout August with lots of fun and messy activities planned!!

September marks a brand new term in pre school and a time when we will be welcoming some new children. Our initial focus, therefore, will be on 'Me Myself and I' where the children will be encouraged to talk about themselves and their families to their friends. This not only provides an opportunity for the children to develop their communication and language skills but is also a nice way for the children to get to know each other. In order to enhance this area we will be creating a Family Display board so if you could send in a family photo, for use on this board, we would be really grateful!! Our role play area will be a 'Home corner' which, hopefully, will allow the children to develop their imaginations by imitating significant roles to them.

Numeracy is a key area for pre school children. If you have any coloured bottle tops at home please could you bring them in as the children love to sort items and group items together thus developing their numeracy skills. We will also be looking at measure and length, using the new tape measures to see how tall they are and look at measurements of different objects in the environment.

September 23rd will be the beginning of a brand new season - 'Autumn'. We will be discussing change with the children and what happens at this time of the year. The children will also be involved in making a scarecrow as part of our harvest theme, using fruit and vegetables to explore sequences.

Linked to the above theme and to enhance the children's literacy skills we will be reading a new story - 'Olivers Vegetables', which also links to our Harvest topic. The children will also be able to taste our home grown produce that they have been tending to over the summer months.

Finally we will be starting our very own forest school sessions which provide fun, risk taking activities for the children to achieve and enjoy as well as learning in a safe outdoor environment. The boys especially thrive off this kind of activity as the majority of their learning is through games and exploration.
