Friday 21st July - Last day of term


Monday 24th July to Friday 2nd September - No funding for Nursery Educational Grant

Medication

Could all parents please be aware that any prescribed medication, including asthma inhalers, must be brought into nursery in the named box that it was prescribed in, this is to ensure the correct dosage is given and following the update in the new **Statutory Early Years Framework 2017** that all prescription medicine must not be administered unless they have been prescribed for a child by a Doctor, Dentist, Nurse or Pharmacist. If you have any queries regarding this, please speak to your child's key person.



Weather

We would kindly ask that you send your child in appropriate clothing for when we are playing outdoors. As the weather gets warmer, we would ask that you apply 8 hour sun cream to your child before they start their session. If your child attends all day then sun cream will need to be provided in order for staff to reapply after lunch. Please ensure the sun cream is named and that you have signed our sun cream procedure form. Please ensure your child has a coat with them every session and we discourage children wearing flip-flops and crocs for safety reasons.

We are therefore asking all parents to let us know as soon as they receive the date when this will be taking place, this will allow us to complete our progress check on time. Thank you.

May

We will be celebrating May Day creating colourful pictures using a range of materials and discussing different colours and textures encouraging language.

The children will be using ribbons and scarves to dance with whilst listening to music.

E.A.D: Exploring media and materials 16-26 months "notices and is interested in the effects of making movements which leave marks "

We are going to be updating our 10 tiny tadpoles display board and changing it into "We're going on a bear hunt", as this is one of the children's favourite stories. The children will create art work that will be displayed onto the board to link with different parts of the story. We will be taking the children on adventure outdoors to explore long wavy grass and thick oozy mud to see if we find a bear!!!

The children will have the opportunity to explore a range of natural materials outdoors this will encourage the children using describing words when using their senses to touch and feel.

E.A.D- Exploring media and materials: 30-50 months "beginning to be interested in and describe the texture of things"

Literacy- Reading: 16-26 months "interested in book and rhymes and may have favourites"

June

As Fathers day approaches the children will be getting creative making crafts for their loved ones. Linking to this we will be talking about families and special occasions at home.

Understanding the world: people and communities 22-36 months " has a sense of own immediate family and relations"

With the season changing into summer on 21st June we will be discussing the changes of the new season and changing our free flow area into a beach theme where the children can explore sand and water. To link with this we will be learning about sun safety and how to keep cool and safe when playing outdoors in the sun.

The children will have lots of opportunities to take part in summer activities where they will be making tasty treats and getting creative.

Understanding the world: the world: 22-36 months - " notices detailed features of objects in their environments"

Throughout July many children and families will be going on holidays we will be discussing different holidays and transportation.

Understanding the world: people and communities: 16-26 months "enjoy pictures and stories about themselves, their families and other people"

The role play area will be changing into a "Mini Explorers" corner where children can dress up, look at summer themed items. E.A.D: being imaginative: 22-36 "beginning to make believe by pretending"

The children will be attempting to use a bat and ball developing their hand eye coordination this is to celebrate Wimbledon. We will also be busy tasting strawberries and other fruits discussing our likes and dislikes P.D: healthy and self care: 16-26 months "develops own likes and dislikes to food and drink



A big Warm Welcome to all our new starters hope you all settle in well and enjoy ladybird life \odot also big welcome to Alice who has recently joined us in the Ladybird room.

We are continuing looking at the very hungry caterpillar story as part of our spring theme. The role play area will be changed into a supermarket, the children will be discovering fruit and vegetables using our senses to touch and feel. We will be developing our hand eye co-ordination using knives to cut them up into pieces to discover what is inside and looking at quantity to see how many pieces/slices they can make. Maths-Number 30-50 Separates a group of three or four objects in different ways, beginning to recognise that the total is still the same.

We are hoping to take the children to the local shop with a shopping list this opportunity will enable the children to speak and recognise colour, shape, size and quantity. Maths -shape, shape and measure 30-50-Shows awareness of similarities of shapes in the environment.

Wednesday May 24th is Polish Mothers day. The children will have the opportunity to draw a picture of their Mummy/ Grandma or carer as well as decorating and creating a card to be sent home.

The children will be busy planting their own fruits and vegetables, they will become involved in the growing process showing an interest and understanding of what is needed to make them grow. Understanding the world-the world 30-50- Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time.

At the top of our garden the children will be creating their own runner bean teepee, and overtime they will be investigating the height using tape measures. The children will be encouraged to use maths language e.g Taller, Shorter. Maths shape space measure 30-50 - Order two or three items by length or height.

Continuing with planting and growing the children will be making their own cress heads. They will use the cress to make cress sandwiches developing hand eye co-ordination spreading butter onto their bread using a knife. Physical-moving and handling 30-50 Uses one-handed tools and equipment, e.g. makes snips in paper with child scissors.

Ladybird children will be inviting their Daddys, Grandads, carers to join them on Tuesday 20th June for forest school. They will be making delicious bacon sandwiches on an open fire if you able to attend please let a member of the Ladybird team know.

We will be providing a school linked display enabling the school leavers to become familiar with school logos, uniform and incorpating themed stories getting the children ready for school and their taster days. Understanding the world-people and communities 30-50 Remembers and talks about significant events in their own experience. Recognises and describes special times or events for family orfriends. Shows interest in different occupations and ways of life.

3rd-16th July is Wimbledon the children will be developing their hand eye co-ordination using bats and balls, and making strawberry skewers which they can enjoy at snack time with their friends.

Graduation ball is on Thursday 18^{th} July 6.30-7.30 the theme is "princess and pirates" this is for the children who are attending school in September.
